Limited Access to Kobe Campus for Commerce under State of Emergency due to COVID-19

On April 7, Japanese Government declared a state of emergency for Hyogo and six other prefectures in Japan over COVID-19 outbreak. Following the declaration, Hyogo Prefecture requested Universities for temporary closing. Responding to the measures, COVID-19 Countermeasures Office of University of Hyogo decided followings:

- The starting date of Spring Semester 2020 is extended to May 6<sup>th</sup>
- Limited Access to Kobe Campus for Commerce
- Alternative arrangement for New Semester's Guidance

Furthermore, the access to the Campus will be limited as follows:

1. Duration: From April 9, 2020 to May 6, 2020
2. Area of off-limits: Kobe Campus for Commerce (Any facilities in the campus cannot be used.)
3. Applicable to students who belong to University of Hyogo
4. Exception: ①Students who have permission from the Dean, requested by Professor acting as advisor to the student (avoid coming to the University unless absolutely necessary), ②students who live in on-campus dormitory (Staying in their own rooms is preferable).
